WHO ARE SAFE STEPS FAMILY VIOLENCE RESPONSE CENTRE?

SAFE STEPS is a 24/7 telephone response. They support women to access refuge and make referrals to regional after-hours face-to-face support. They also make referrals for a range of other needs. Call **SAFE STEPS** on 1800 015 188



Victim/survivor applies for a Family Violence Intervention Order

Applicant Practitioner or Court Support person may refer the victim/survivor to **THE ORANGE DOOR**



Police conduct preliminary risk assessment and MUST refer to **THE ORANGE DOOR**

If the victim/survivor requires an immediate response outside business hours or refuge, Police will refer to **SAFE STEPS FAMILY VIOLENCE RESPONSE CENTRE**

If a child or young person is present police may refer to **CHILD PROTECTION** (refer to Children's pathway for more information)



THE ORANGE DOOR will triage all referrals, conduct a comprehensive risk assessment and safety planning, provide information and support

SAFE STEPS conducts comprehensive risk assessment and safety planning 24/7 by phone

The victim/survivor can contact **THE ORANGE DOOR** as a se referrer by phone, email or walk-in



Police may issue a Family Violence Safety Notice and initiate a Family Violence Intervention Order process

They may also initiate a criminal process

If there is imminent risk of death they will refer to a Risk Assessment Management panel (RAMP)

Service conducts a preliminary MARAM risk assessment If the victim/survivor is immediate danger, service calls police with her consent

Alternatively the service may access secondary consultation or support by calling **THE ORANGE DOOR**, or **SAFE STEPS**

If Police are not called the service may consult with **CHILD PROTECTION** if there is a reasonable belief that a child or young person is in need of protection due to:

- Concerns of sexual or physical abuse or
- Concerns of significant harm or neglect
- Concerns of emotional or psychological harm

THE ORANGE DOOR provides crisis and intake services THE ORANGE DOOR can refer to family violence counselling case management and or integrated Family Services and Men's Perpetrator services and refer to other agencies and services as needed. Call THE ORANGE DOOR on 1800 319 353

All services use the family violence information sharing scheme, and MARAM to assess and manage risk
