Police attend incident. They may issue a Family Violence Safety Notice and initiate a civil justice response (Family Violence Intervention Order).

Police make a referral to **THE ORANGE DOOR** Or the **MEN'S REFERRAL SERVICE**.

A referral is made to **CHILD PROTECTION** if police have a reasonable belief that a child or young person is in need of protection due to:

- Concerns of sexual or physical abuse or
- Concerns of significant harm or neglect
- Concerns of emotional or psychological harm



UNIVERSAL AND HEALTH SERVICES

Professional from mainstream or universal service identifies man's use of violence

If victim survivor is in immediate danger, call the police

If he is willing to engage with services call **THE ORANGE DOOR** or **MEN'S REFERRAL SERVICE**

Provide information about Men's Behaviour Change or other intervention programs.

Consult with **CHILD PROTECTION** if there is a reasonable belief that a child or young person is in need of protection due to:

- Concerns of sexual or physical abuse or
- Concerns of significant harm or neglect
- Concerns of emotional or psychological harm

Call **CHILD PROTECTION** on 13 12 78

Men who use violence attend court or engages with Corrections and/ or Child Protection

Men who use violence receive counselling order or are mandated to attend a Men's Behaviour Change/ intervention program.

If attendance at a Men's Behaviour Change/ intervention program is not mandated, but he is interested in attending, the worker provides information about most relevant program for self referral.



THE ORANGE DOOR or The **MEN'S REFERRAL SERVICE** will triage all referrals, conduct a comprehensive risk assessment and safety planning and may refer to Men's Behaviour Change program, or intervention program, case management and other services including mental health, AOD, homelessness as necessary

Partner contact is maintained and the victim survivor can be provided with relevant support.

Men who use violence can contact the Statewide **MEN'S REFERRAL SERVICE** or **THE ORANGE DOOR** to disclose his use of violence by phone, email or walk-in

WHO ARE THE ORANGE DOOR?

THE ORANGE DOOR provides crisis and intake services. **THE ORANGE DOOR** can refer to family violence counselling case management and or integrated Family Services and Men's Perpetrator services and refer to other agencies and services as needed. Call **THE ORANGE DOOR** on 1800 319 353

THE MEN'S REFERRAL SERVICE is a free, confidential telephone helpline that offers counselling, advice and support to men who have anger, relationship or parenting issues.
